

R. M. OF KEYS NO. 303

BYLAW NO. 93-1

A Bylaw of the Rural municipality of Keys to designate the property known as Wilson Hill, Saskatchewan as being a site of historical value.

WHEREAS part III of The Heritage Property Act authorizes the council of a municipality to enact bylaws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be architectural, historical or natural value or interest; and

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Rural Municipality of Keys has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises known as Wilson Hill at SW 20-33-03 w2 a Notice of Intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such Notice of Intention to be published in at least two issues of a newspaper with general circulation in the municipality with the first publication at least twenty-one (21) days prior to the date of consideration of the bylaw and with the last publication at least seven (7) days prior to the date of that consideration; and

WHEREAS no Notice of Objection to the proposed designation has been served on the clerk of the municipality;

THEREFORE, the council of the Council of the Corporation of the Rural Municipality of Keys No. 303 enacts as follows:

1. There is designated as being historical value or interest the real property known as Wilson Hill at SW 20-33-03-w2 and legally described as:

all that portion of the South West Quarter of Section 20, Township 33, Range 3, west of the second meridian, Saskatchewan described as: commencing at the south West corner of the quarter section; thence Easterly along the Southern boundry of the Quarter Section 752 feet; thence Northerly perpendicular to the Southern boundary 381 feet; thence Westerly parallel with the Southern boundary to the Western boundary of the quarter section; thence Southerly along the Western boundary to the point of commencement.

Except: Firstly; portion taken for Roadway on Plan AP162 Secondly; portion of Parcel A taken for Roadway on Plan 65Y00436.

Minerals in the Crown.

The Significance of the site is as follows:

- a. The Wilson family came to Crystal Lake area in 1901.
- b. Mary Elizabeth Reynolds Wilson was instrumental in creating a library, as well as a small cultural centre.
- c. Mrs. Wilson also organized the first Crystal Lake baseball team; first Crystal Lake Band, complete with uniforms, as well as first golf course and race tracks.
- d. The site is a landmark in the community.

2. The Rural Administrator is hereby authorized to cause a certified copy of this bylaw to be registered against the property described above in the proper Land Titles Office.

3. The Rural Administrator is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this bylaw to be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the minister and to cause notice of the passing of this bylaw.

4. This bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the day of the final passing thereof.
